MATERIALS

- **Drawers** ~
- **Tape measure**
- Saw
- Screwdriver
- **Paint rollers**
- **Paint primer**
- Spray paint
- Wood screws
- **Drywall anchor**
- Wall cleat

STEPS

Put Me in the

- 1. Remove all Hardware (handles/ knobs)
- 2. Measure 6 inches from the front of the drawer to the back and mark 3. Use your saw to cut across the 6 inch mark
- 4. Prime your drawers and paint them any color you would like
- 5. Reattach the knobs and handles after the drawer has dried
- 6. Mark on your wall where you would like to hang your new bookshelves and make sure it is level
- 7 Hang a wall cleat using the drywall anchors
- 8. Secure the shelf to the cleat using the wood screws and you're done!
