Thanks to your donations and support, we have started 4 new home builds for 4 local families. Shalyn and her sons, David and Jeanne, James and his daughter, and Cheyenne and her daughter all are excited that ground breaking has begun on their new homes. Though these builds are just beginning, these families have been working hard in our homeownership program for months completing sweat equity hours and learning important skills through our homeowner education classes.

The process of homeownership isn't easy or fast. Our homeowners are in our program for an average of two years before they move into their homes. Before construction on a home is started, funding needs to be resourced through sponsorships, grants, and other donors like yourself. Rochelle, President and CEO reminds each homeowner on their dedication day "Today is finally your day!" because, throughout the program, families are reminded it takes patience until it's their turn to receive keys.

Habitat relies heavily on volunteer work to offset the cost of labor on each home. On average, Habitat homes require the help of over 300 volunteers who dedicate over 2,500 hours of work. We have experienced many

STEPS

- For your safety, make sure everything is unplugged before starting. Get your lamp and prepare to remove electrical parts.
- 2. First, snip off the plug.
- 3. Remove the felt at the base of the lamp. Loosen the nut at the bottom of the lamp and pull the socket/wiring right out of the top.
- You should be left with a clean and smooth shell base.
- Next, you will need an 18" round tabletop. For the base, trace a circle onto a small scrap of 1-inch plywood.
- Using the jigsaw, cut out the base.
 Then use the palm sander to smooth the edges and match the tabletop.
- 7. Prime and then paint the base, pedestal, and top. It's recommended to use a paint roller on the table/base and a paintbrush on the pedestal. Spread the paint evenly.
- Make sure your base, pedestal, and top are painted and dried completely before proceeding.
- After the paint is dry, glue the base, the pedestal, and the top together with wood glue. Let it dry.
- 10. Your DIY project is now complete and ready for use!

Affiliate Growth Serves More Families

Thanks to your support, our affiliate was able to grow in 2021 and we have plans to continue to grow in 2022 to help serve more families in Summit County through our programming. From new staff additions, to newly created positions and promotions within, we are expanding to provide a stronger organization. This is all possible thanks to the many partners, like you, who believe in our mission to build a world where everyone has a decent place to live.

We have 3 new positions including a development officer focused on new corporate foundations relations, a Marketing Coordinator, and a Neighborhood Network Coordinator. Seven staff have recently been promoted within the company including Vice President and Chief Financial Officer, Vice President and Chief Operating Officer, Family Services Manager and Qualified Loan Originator, Aging in Place and Faith Relations Coordinator and ReStore Key Holders. We plan to hire some additional staff in the next six months in our construction and home repair program as well as a staff accountant.

Our construction department is now operating under a new structure with each site supervisor managing their individual build projects. Each supervisor is responsible for all project tasks, from ordering supplies, scheduling subcontractors and inspections. This allows them to take ownership of their projects giving them new leadership opportunities. We have built new office space in our construction warehouse for our construction staff. Thanks to Metis Construction Services the space was done in 30 days.

We are thankful for the opportunity to grow both our staff and office space, especially through such a challenging time. Though we were delayed by COVID19, we still plan on continuing forward with our Imagine Impact campaign goals. From April 2020 to March 2026, we plan to build and rehab 75 homes, repair 150 homes, change 1,000 lives and mobilize 10,000 volunteers. This won't be possible without your help. Ring Doorbell and other Security Systems

At Habitat, we have many wonderful corporate sponsors and we are so thankful for their support of our mission. We recently had a homeownership class with a Lowe's employee and licensed electrician who taught our families how to install a Ring Doorbell at their new homes. Lowe's is one of our sponsors who support in helping build homes as well as offering to participate with our homeownership classes.

The Lowe's representative, Belinda, explained to us that the first step is to turn off the electric to the doorbell. We had some questions about how to know which circuit the doorbell is on. Belinda told us to have someone ring the front doorbell while you are at the breaker box trying different breakers. The next step is to unhook the old doorbell and using the same wires, attach them to the Ring doorbell. Mount the doorbell with the screws included and turn the power back on. One of the questions we had was how do we assure no one will take the Ring Doorbell? There is a security screw included with your Ring doorbell that needs to be installed as well. The final step is to download the app on your smart device and set up your doorbell. In order to view the doorbell recordings you do need to have

internet in your home. In order to have Ring Protect, this requires a subscription which can be set up and purchased at www.ring.com/protect-plans. Ring also offers other products such as outdoor security lights, cameras, and window sensors. Ring has a one year warranty and will work with Amazon Alexa's voice commands.

Feeling safe in your home in important. Another great app available is Neighbors. The Neighbors app allows others to share videos, get alerts, and report crime. We have talked about Neighborhood Watches during our homeownership classes. The Neighbors app is very similar. Just last summer, there was a spotting of a bear in Summit County. Through the use of captured videos, people were able to follow sightings of the bear. I have also seen video advising that owners watch their small pets when there are coyotes in the area.

An article written by Drew Harwell in the Washington Post on August 28, 2019 discussed the partnership with 400 police forces and the Ring doorbell. With the partnership, police can request a video recording from a homeowner through Ring. According to the article, the partnership "can assist police investigators and protect homes from criminals, intruders, and thieves."

There are several other affordable security systems including Simplisafe, Arlo, Vivint, ADT, etc. We have to give our families peace of mind when they move into their new home.
