What is NN's biggest/proudest accomplishment in the past 10 years?

I think being able to say that neighbors feel like they are part of the network is one of the most fulfilling things. She coordinated the 12 Middlebury neighborhood businesses and organizations who each hosted a table that provided a game or resource for the neighborhood during the 5K festival. 1ST PLACE Best Chili Recipe Hi y'all! Here's the recipe for my chili! FYI, I no longer measure seasoning, I just have a feel for how much I want in my food when I cook. What is below is an approximation of how much of each seasoning I used. Please feel free to add more of each to taste if you feel like it needs more, and always remember to taste as you go! Chili Cookoff First Place Winner, Jake Tancer

First Annual Chili Cook-off Winner

Ingredients:

- 2 lbs. lean ground beef (80/20) (can also be made with turkey)
- 1 green pepper
- 1 sweet yellow/Vidalia onion
- ½ head or 1 tbsp. minced garlic
- 12 oz. crushed tomatoes with Italian seasoning
- 1 large can red kidney beans
- 2 cans black beans
- 3 cans Campbell's condensed tomato soup
- 4 packets, McCormick's Original Chili seasoning
- · 2 tbsps. Lowry's Seasoned Salt
- 1 tbsp. Original Mrs. Dash
- · 2 tsps. Oregano
- · Black pepper, fresh ground if possible
- Kosher salt
- · 1 tbsp olive oil

Food Prep:

- 1. Finely chop sweet onion
- 2. Blister green pepper either over an open flame on your range OR under the broiler on high in your over. Let cool until you can touch it, and finely chop it
- 3. Mince garlic
- 4. DO NOT drain beans or crushed tomatoes

Cooking:

- 1. Heat oil in large pot over medium heat
- 2. Add chopped onion and a pinch of salt and pepper, cooking until translucent 5-7 minutes
- 3. Add chopped blistered green pepper and stir, cooking until very soft 2-3 minutes
- 4. Add minced garlic, cooking until fragrant and translucent 1 minute
- 5. Add beef (and/or turkey) and a pinch of salt and cook until browned, stirring occasionally
- 6. Add McCormick's seasoning packets, Lowry's Seasoned Salt, oregano, and black pepper to taste (maybe 1 tsps.) Stir.
- 7. Add 12oz crushed tomatoes
- 8. Add kidney beans and black beans, including liquid in can. Stir.
- 9. Add in Campbell's tomato soup, stirring frequently, only adding until you've reached your desired consistency. YOU MAY NOT NEED ALL 3 CANS, only add until you've reached the consistency that you like your chili. THEN! Add ½ cup more Campbell's soup to make the chili too thin. Stir. Increase heat until boiling, then reduce to a simmer. Let chili simmer and reduce until it's back at the consistency you would like it to be. For me, it took 2 hours, but I would check every 30 minutes to stir, taste, and check the consistency until the chili is ready!



Home is the key to a brighter future

- 1. First, collect and wipe down your barstools.
- Next, paint the seat white. Use white chalk paint for a distressed look. Let that paint dry and reapply as needed.
- Secure your doily down before painting to avoid messing up.
- Use a sponge brush and paint over the doily. Make sure to not use too much paint at a time or it will smudge.
- Repeat the process with the remaining barstools.
 Let the paint dry before proceeding to the next step.
- 6. The final step is painting the legs black. Use black chalk paint to cover the legs, bars, and underside of the seat. Paint the second layer and touch up as needed.
