

Rare, Unicorn Bottles That Could Be Yours!



E.H. Taylor, Jr. Warehouse C Bourbon

This ten-year-old Bottled-in-Bond bourbon was aged in Warehouse C, built by Col. Taylor in 1885, and the barrel warehouse he was most proud of – the final piece in his “model distillery.” Like some of the previous releases, this one-time-only bottling of E.H. Taylor, Jr Warehouse C Bourbon is very limited.

The ideal aging locations for these barrels led to a wonderful flavor combination, with a nose of cherry cobbler with rum sauce and a hint of oak; a palate of cherry cola, vanilla bean and toasted oak; and a finish that is long and lingering with a hint of spearmint, coffee, raisin bread and anise.

Old Fitzgerald Bottled-In-Bond, Spring 2021

Heaven Hill Distillery's Old Fitzgerald Bottled-in-Bond Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey Decanter Series is released every spring and fall. Bottled in an ornate decanter, the spring edition denotes a green label, which will stay consistent across all spring releases.

As a leader of the Bottled-in-Bond category, Heaven Hill offers a premium, allocated product within this special class that showcases the authenticity and quality of their American whiskey portfolio. Acquired in 1999 by Heaven Hill, the legendary Old Fitzgerald line is well-known for its distilling pedigree and intriguing story behind its namesake, John E. Fitzgerald.

Earth Day

As a former teacher, I remember giving my student's a gift in April each year. Each April, we would receive saplings to share with our students for them to take home to plant. As a parent, it became a family event to plant the sapling each year. I remember some of us called it an Arbor Day gift, sometimes it was in recognition of Earth Day. Both events always had a theme: Caring for our Earth. So how did these events get started?



Arbor Day began in the early 1870s. Julius Morton and his wife moved to Nebraska. They had purchased a large property and planted trees on the land. Morton believed that trees were important for our environment and ecology. He wanted to encourage others to plant more trees and suggested having a Day-Arbor Day-as a day to plant trees. In 1907 President Roosevelt issued an Arbor Day Proclamation to school children which was: "It is well that you should celebrate your Arbor Day thoughtfully, for within your lifetimes the Nation's need of trees will become serious. We of an older generation can get along with what we have, though with growing hardship; but in your full manhood and womanhood you will want what nature once so bountifully supplied and man so thoughtlessly destroyed."

Some residents from our area may remember the Cuyahoga River caught fire in June of 1969. During the 1970s the Vietnam war was going on, leaded gas was being used in our automobiles, and air pollution was "accepted as the smell of prosperity". Those who grew up in Akron, like my husband, remember when the rubber industry was active in Akron and remember the smell some believed was the smell of prosperity. In January 1969, Senator Gaylord Nelson from Wisconsin, and Pete McCloskey worked together to get Americans to take notice of the deteriorating environment in the United States. On April 22, 1970, the first Earth Day was celebrated and Arbor Day was nationally recognized. About this same time, President Nixon and Congress passed The Clean Air Act, Endangered Species Act, the Occupational Safety and Health Act, and created the Environmental Protection Agency.

Habitat builds houses that are built to a higher environmental standard, climate controlled and free from lead and mold to help improve family's health. This is part of our Imagine Impact Campaign. We are excited to celebrate another community Earth Day event on Friday, April 21, 2023 by holding a Recycling Event. We will be accepting paper for shredding, electronics, Latex Paint free for this one day, ReStore donations, and more. 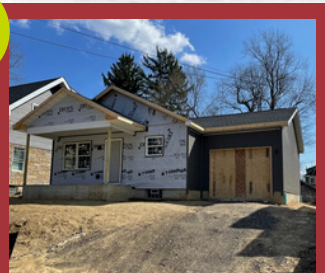

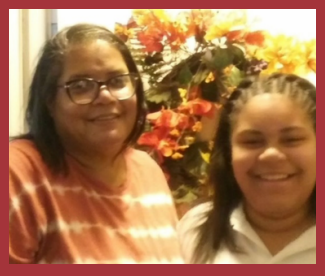

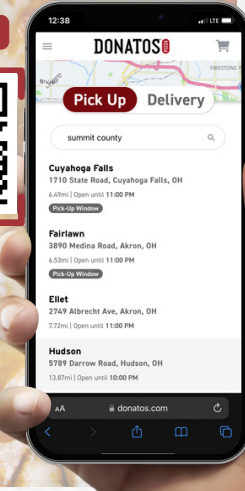
